









a club's entry into a championship requires prior agreement by the already participating clubs


#### **Competitive Balance**


a constraints to equalize the chances ... and for the interest of competition












Number of titles (1975 - 2005)





#### **Sport Criteria**

- more revenues for teams in big TV markets




#### Advantages for the metropolis


UEFA Cup, CW Cup and city size (1975 - 2005)






**Champions League (1975 – 2005)** 


Champions League Points and city size (1975 - 2005)




